The Reverend Doctor Diane Miller entered the Unitarian Universalist ministry in her twenties and has served in a range of capacities. She served congregations in San Francisco, CA and Belmont, Massachusetts, before being appointed Director of Ministry for the Unitarian Universalist Association (1993-2001). During her final two years at the UUA she was a candidate for President of the Association. When FRS was preparing for an interim ministry to follow the retirement of Woody Woodrick, the congregation agreed to have whichever candidate was not elected as its Interim Minister for 2001-03, and so Diane came to Carlisle. She continued doing Interim ministries with congregations in Golden, Colorado; Providence, Rhode Island; and Walnut Creek, CA.

A native of Rochester, Minnesota, she is a graduate of Macalester College and Harvard Divinity School, and has an honorary doctorate from Starr King School for the Ministry.

She has two sons in their twenties, Graham Durall and Drew Miller, and is now divorced after a long marriage.

Diane has served in several capacities as a denominational leader. She was a member of the committee which crafted the UUA Principles and Purposes in the 1980s. She is a board member of UUSC (the Unitarian Universalist Service Committee) and on the Alumni/Alumnae Council of Harvard Divinity School.
